In a few minutes, voters can learn exactly what the candidates say about their nuclear weapons policies. And there are significant differences – even between members of the same party, like Barack Obama and Hilary Clinton.

*Nuclear weapons pose the most immediate catastrophic threat to the planet and its people. Recent unrest in the nuclear-armed country of Pakistan has underlined the urgency of confronting the issue.*
