U.S. ARMY CAPTAIN NAMED NEW PEACE LEADERSHIP DIRECTOR



The Nuclear Age Peace Foundation has a new employee, and he comes from an unexpected source -- the US Army.

Captain Paul Chappell is a West Point graduate and an Iraq veteran who once commanded missile defenses. He has just begun work as the NAPF's new Peace Leadership Director.

Paul is a truly remarkable individual. Just this year, while still in the Army and only 28 years-old, his book *Will War Ever End?: A Soldier's Vision of Peace for the 21st Century* was published.

Like many veterans, Paul's military service clarified his resolve to work for peace:

"One hundred years ago people were developing automatic machine guns, and today we have enough nuclear weapons to destroy the planet several times over," he wrote. "Since technology will continue to increase our capacity for destruction, and the demand for nuclear weapons is growing around the world, the question *Will War Ever End?* can be reworded: Will humanity survive or will we destroy ourselves?"

David Krieger, President of the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation, feels Paul will make a big difference at the Foundation and in the world. Krieger stated:

"Paul has a deep commitment to peace, and a great story to share with people of all ages. He is a young man determined to make our world more peaceful."

Paul Chappell has developed a description of the program he now leads:

“The Peace Leadership Program provides an opportunity to learn and practice skills that can help you effectively wage peace. First and foremost, we seek to develop peace leadership skills that will help achieve a world free of nuclear weapons. The Peace Leadership Program offers innovative training in leadership, interpersonal communication, and conflict resolution. The program also offers inspiration, guidance, resources, and a community of people dedicated to creating a saner and safer future. Whether you are able to commit five minutes, five hours, or five days a week toward peace and nuclear weapons abolition, the Peace Leadership Program will help you learn the art and science of waging peace so that you can better serve humanity, protect our planet, and make a difference.”
