SANTA BARBARA – The Nuclear Age Peace Foundation is hosting an event at the United Nations in New York City during the Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference on Monday, May 3, from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm.

The panel discussion is entitled “From Omnicide to Abolition: Shifting the Mindset.” Foundation President David Krieger is a speaker on the panel and Director of Programs Rick Wayman will moderate. Other speakers include Steven Starr (NAPF Associate), Alice Slater (NAPF New York representative), Jackie Cabasso, Rob Green and Kate Dewes.

The discussion will focus on The Foundation’s latest publication -- a substantive roadmap to nuclear disarmament written expressly for the 2010 Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference.

Nuclear Non-Proliferation and Disarmament: Shifting the Mindset – A Briefing Booklet for the 2010 Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference, written by Dr. Krieger, delivers a blueprint for a future without nuclear weapons.

In the area of nuclear disarmament and nonproliferation, there is perhaps no more important international gathering this year than the 2010 Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference. The *Briefing Booklet* has been delivered to all ambassadors in New York attending the NPT Review Conference as well as key members of the US Congress and the Obama administration.
