The Symbolism of Sunflowers

Sunflowers have become the symbol of a world free of nuclear weapons. This came about after an extraordinary celebration of Ukraine achieving the status of a nuclear weapon-free state.

On June 1, 1996, Ukraine transferred to Russia for dismantlement the last of the 1,900 nuclear warheads it had inherited from the former Soviet Union. A few days later, the Defense Ministers of Ukraine, Russia and the United States met at a former nuclear missile base in Ukraine that once housed 80 nuclear missiles aimed at the United States.

The three Defense Ministers planted sunflowers and scattered sunflower seeds. US Secretary of Defense William Perry said, “Sunflowers instead of missiles in the soil would ensure peace for future generations.”
