Judge Christopher Weeramantry has spent his life trying to strengthen international law so that the lives of people everywhere will get better.

His honors are many and distinguished. He received a Right Livelihood Award in 2007

for his work in international law and how it applies to "current global challenges such as the continued threat of nuclear weapons, the protection of human rights and the protection of the environment." In 2006, he was awarded a UNESCO Prize for Peace Education for his "indefatigable campaign for peace and peace education, promotion of human rights, intercultural faith and understanding." Only last December, he received the National Honour of Sri Lanka, the highest award bestowed by his native country.

In 1996, he was one of the 14 judges on the International Court of Justice when it rendered its opinion on the illegality of nuclear weapons – one of the most important ever set down by the Court.

He will be joined by other members of the World Future Council at the dinner, including Jakob von Uexküll, Bianca Jagger and Hans Peter Dürr.
